



VISITING SCHOLARS PROGRAM 2012

CALL FOR APPLICATIONS

INFORMATION FOR APPLICANTS

The Visiting Scholars Program at the ARC Centre of Excellence in Policing and Security supports domestic and international scholars wishing to undertake research at any of our four university nodes (Griffith University, The Australian National University, The University of Queensland and Charles Sturt University), as part of its mission to promote research, education and dialogue. The program is highly competitive and aims to have approximately 8-10 visiting scholars each year.

The Centre has a broad research agenda which includes:-

- **Vulnerable Communities**
- **Extending Frontiers**
- **Governing for Security**
- **Attacking Serious and Organised Crime**

Applications from scholars interested in these themes from any discipline are welcomed. Further information about these clusters and their specific projects can be found on our website at www.ceps.edu.au.

Visitors will be invited to participate in Centre's programs, including the Centre's seminars, roundtables, workshops and conferences across our four nodes.

Types of Award

Visiting Fellow (with grant)

This Fellowship is for a period between one and six months. The grant can be used towards accommodation and airfares. The maximum contribution is AUD\$10,000. This financial assistance for travel and accommodation expenses is not intended to be a salary replacement and Visiting Scholars are not employed by CEPS or the respective universities.

Visiting Fellow (with partial grant)

This Fellowship is for a period between one and six months. The grant can be used towards accommodation and airfares. The maximum contribution is AUD\$2,500. This financial assistance for travel and accommodation expenses is not intended to be a salary replacement and Visiting Scholars are not employed by CEPS or the respective universities.

Visiting Fellow (without grant)

Academic staff from the ARC Centre of Excellence in Policing and Security, other universities and institutions may apply to use the facilities at the Centre during periods of research leave (e.g. sabbatical).

Visiting Scholar

This scholarship of AUD\$5000 supports PhD students and Early Career Academics (within two years of the



completion of their doctoral studies). This financial assistance is for travel and accommodation.

Short-term Visitor

Short-term visitors, those visiting the Centre for less than one month, who wish to participate in the ARC Centre of Excellence's program of activities, may apply **at any time** to visit the Centre. Participants may apply for reimbursement of travel and/or accommodation costs.

Visiting Police/Practitioner Fellow

This Fellowship is for a period between one and six months. The grants can be used towards accommodation at the University and airfares for the Visiting Fellow. The maximum contribution for travel is AUD\$10,000. This financial assistance for travel and accommodation expenses is not a salary replacement.

SELECTION CRITERIA

- (i) Quality of applicant;
- (ii) Relevance to existing programs of research at CEPS;
- (iii) Quality of the research proposal; and
- (iv) Capacity to develop domestic/international strategic relationships beneficial to CEPS.

CENTRE FACILITIES

The ARC Centre of Excellence in Policing and Security spans across four nodes; Griffith University, The Australian National University, The University of Queensland and Charles Sturt University. Visiting Fellows are entitled to access all University facilities, such as libraries, health services etc. Offices are equipped with networked computers that provide access to the Internet and email. The Centre also provides some administrative support and assistance.

APPLICATION PROCEDURES

1. Application Form

Applicants should submit a completed application form, together with a CV and list of publications and/or professional activities. Downloadable at www.ceps.edu.au

2. Project Proposal

Applicants should provide a one to two page description of their planned research project. More information can be found at www.ceps.edu.au

3. Referees' Reports

Applicants need to provide the names of two referees who will support their application. Referees should submit their confidential report separately to the ARC Centre of Excellence in Policing and Security on the form provided, by the closing date of that Call for Applications.
